**„The Mutiny on the Bounty’s Role in Genetics
Research”**

Professor Lyn Griffiths is a molecular geneticist who has been studying the genes involved in common human disorders for nearly two decades. Her expertise is in the field of human gene mapping and focuses on identifying the genes involved in common complex disorders, including migraine, cardiovascular disease and several types of cancer.

Professor Griffiths graduated from the University of NSW Biochemistry Department in 1980, gained a PhD from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Sydney in 1990 and in 2007, she established the Genomics Research Centre at Griffith University on the Gold Coast. She has published over 280 research papers, supervised over 40 Postgraduates, 38 Honours students and received significant competitive grant and industry funding. Professor Griffiths was a Queensland Finalist for Australian of the Year in 2005, a nominee for the Queenslander of the Year award in 2006 and has been awarded a Centenary Medal for Distinguished Service to Education and Medical Research.

Before taking the role of Executive Director of the Institute of Health and Biomedical Innovation (IHBI) at QUT, Prof Griffiths was at Griffith University where she was Head of The School of Medical Science from 2004 to 2007, held the role of Dean Research 2007-2012 and was Director of the Griffith Health Institute. She currently is Director of the Genomics Research Centre and Executive Director of IHBI at QUT.
